INVESTIGATIVE SUMMARY | 22-107

Findings of Misconduct by an FBI Special Agent in Charge for Engaging in Sexual Contact with a Subordinate in an Official Government Vehicle and Sexual Communications with Two Other Subordinate Staff Members

The Department of Justice (DOJ) Office of the Inspector General (OIG) initiated an investigation upon the receipt of information from the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) Inspection Division (INSD) alleging that a then FBI Special Agent in Charge (SAC) engaged in communications that were sexual in nature and sexual relationships with subordinate employees. The information alleged further that the SAC engaged in sexual acts in an official government vehicle with one of the employees.

The OIG investigation substantiated the allegation that the SAC engaged in sexual contact with a subordinate in an official government vehicle and had communications that were sexual in nature with that subordinate and two other subordinate staff members, in violation of FBI policy.

The SAC retired while the OIG's investigation was ongoing.

The OIG has completed its investigation and provided its report to the FBI for appropriate action.



Unless otherwise noted, the OIG applies the preponderance of the evidence standard in determining whether Department of Justice personnel have committed misconduct.
